Gospel:

A Reading from the Gospel according to John: [13:1, 2b-10a; 12-17, 33-35] Glory to you, O God.

Reader 1

It was before Passover, and Jesus realized that the time had come for him to pass from this world to his loving God. Jesus had always loved those in this world; but, now, he showed how complete this love was.

Reader 2

During supper...Jesus rose from the table, took off his clothes and wrapped a towel around his waist. He then poured some water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel that was round his waist. When Jesus came to Simon Peter, Peter said, "Rabbi, you're not going to wash my feet, are you?...You will never wash my feet!" Jesus answered, "If I don't wash you, you have no part with me."

Reader 3

After washing their feet, Jesus put his clothes back on and returned to the table. He said to the disciples, "Do you understand what I have done and what it means? You call me 'Teacher' and 'Leader' — and rightly, for I am. If I, then — your Teacher and Leader — have washed your feet, you must wash each other's feet. I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you...I give you a new commandment...Love one another the way I have loved you. This is how all will know that you are my disciples: that you Love one another."
